DOAJ (Directory of Open Access Journals)

Characteristics:

The DOAJ database was created in 2003 at Lund University in Sweden. The service provides access to over 17,000 peer-reviewed open access scientific journals (links to journal homepages, abstracts and full scientific articles). The database covers all fields of science: technology, medicine, social sciences and humanities.

Searching:

Searching the database can be done simply by typing any term into the search box and selecting the *journals* and/or *articles* collection. For each journal title searched, you will receive information on the licence under which the journal publishes its articles.

The advanced search allows you to narrow your search to the subject area, the type of licence under which the publication is available (e.g. CC-BY, CC-BY-NC, etc.), the name of the publishing house, the country of the publisher, the language of the publication.

All articles and journals available in the database have been classified according to the subject classification of the Library of Congress (The Library of Congress Classification).
